A Letter from Fr. Jim about Ohio School Choice

Dear St. Dominic Parishioners,

As you may know, the Ohio Legislature recently passed, and Governor Dewine signed, what he calls "School Choice" within the 2023-2025 two-year budget for the State of Ohio.

Here are the facts of this new state funding: Ohio School Choice offers scholarships of up to \$6,165.00 for each student. A substantial number of our St. Dominic families will qualify for a full scholarship, and all others will qualify for a partial scholarship based on family income. With this funding, we can move from a family-paid tuition model to an enhanced tuition model where the State of Ohio and your taxes pay the lion's share. This program creates an opportunity for an increase in funding for the school while substantially reducing tuition paid by almost all parents.

The new School Choice program is currently funded for two years. Of course, the expectation by state leadership is that this will be a long-term funding program. Each school chooses annually if they want to participate in this program. We will certainly participate, and our school families have been notified. We will continue to help families with the Fr. Walsh Scholarship as needed.

We hope to benefit from increased demand from public school students. For those Catholic families who have chosen public schools purely for financial reasons, they can now afford to send their kids to a Catholic school.

School Choice Tuition Facts

Families with an Adjusted Gross Income at or below 450% of the Federal Poverty Level are eligible for a full student scholarship. Families with an AGI above 450% are eligible for a tiered, reduced scholarship.

Parental Preparation for Infant Baptism

Safe Parish Requirements for Those Volunteering with Children

SafeParish is the child protection platform for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. All new volunteers should follow the SafeParish registration instructions for creating a SafeParish account. You can find a copy of the SafeParish registration instructions and a link to SafeParish on our website at www.stdominichelhi.org. Click on the *SafeParish* button on the left side of the page.

During the registration process, new volunteers will be invited to complete their background check and child protection training online. The \$25.00 fee for this can be paid by credit card or with a "token." Contact the parish ministry for which you volunteer to get information on obtaining a token for payment. Weekly Emails - Each Tuesday, SafeParish sends an email regarding the updated child protection and workplace safety articles that are posted on the SafeParish website. These articles are NOT required, but are recommended reading.

Quarterly Bulletins - Everyone registered with SafeParish will receive a quarterly video. The training bulletin must be completed in 30 days to remain active and in compliance with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Child Protection Policy.

An In-Compliance list is posted to the St. Dominic Parish website on the 15th of each month. No one may work with children if they are not active and in compliance. If you did not get the bulletin, check your spam or junk mail. You can also sign into your account, go to the *Training* tab and click on the "Due" link to see which bulletins are due and their due date.
